PRINCIPLE OF THE JOURNEY

The Martin's Cycle Tour is a 7-day, 8-night cycling trip between the Martin's Hotels in Brussels, Walloon Brabant, Flemish Brabant and the Province of Antwerp.

Each stage starts from one hotel and will lead you to the next hotel. You can start your journey from the hotel of your choice that is involved in the Martin's Cycle Tour:

- **MARTIN'S RED - TUBIZE** (Hotel of the Red Devils training centre)
Between old canals and battlefields
- **MARTIN'S WATERLOO**
Abbeys, castles and divine beverages
- **MARTIN'S CHÂTEAU DU LAC - GENVAL**
Old stones, strange stones and new stones
- **MARTIN'S LOUVAIN-LA-NEUVE**
From one university to another, from one century to another
- **MARTIN'S KLOOSTER - LEUVEN**
In the land of the river Dyle
- **MARTIN'S PATERSHOF - MECHELEN**
Arrival in Brussels on the garden side
- **MARTIN'S BRUSSELS EU**
Beers, forests and traditions

However, if you want to come by car to start the Martin's Cycle Tour, we advise you to start your first stage with an overnight stay in Tubize as presented in this roadbook and therefore to start your journey from the Martin's Red as this one is provided with a car park where you can leave your car for the whole duration of your cycling trip between the hotels.

It is of course possible to do only a few stages and return to your starting point by train. All destinations have a train station and you can board the train with your bike.

TECHNICAL ADVICE

We recommend that you take the Martin's Cycle Tour with confidence:

- Use a recently serviced bike that you have had the opportunity to try and adjust to your measurements. Don't hesitate to change the posture settings on the way.
- Depending on the road surface, we recommend that you use good, wide tyres with the correct air pressure. Don't forget to check the pressure regularly.
- Carry one repair kit per person (including a pump) and at least one spare inner tube.
- To get the most out of your trip, to carry only the essentials and to travel light. Two 20L panniers are more than enough to carry everything.
- Take a battery with you to recharge your phone or GPS.

And of course don't forget to take your precious road-book with you!



Join Ronquières to contemplate the impressive inclined plane! Driving along the old canal, you will arrive at the Château de Seneffe, an 18th century jewel of neo-classical architecture and its park and gardens, magnificent green settings with different atmospheres. You will take a section of the Ravel passing through Nivelles and then head north towards Waterloo, passing two historic sites of the famous battle: the Hougoumont farm and the Wellington museum.

START : a loop that starts from your hotel in Tubize and goes to your hotel in Waterloo. Follow the GPX track using your app.



TO BE DISCOVERED

1 Inclined plane of Ronquières

The Ronquières Inclined Plane, which extends over 1500 metres, is unique in its kind and compensates for a 70 metre difference in height. Discover this fabulous site thanks to its Visitor Center with a panoramic lift and a glass footbridge overlooking the inclined plane.

2 Old Ronquières Canal

A vestige of industrial heritage, it is a route of the 70-tonne and 300-tonne gauge canal which links Seneffe (from the old boat tunnels) to Ronquières (lock 27). It was disused in 1958 following the closure of the Godarville tunnel.



You leave Waterloo to reach La Hulpe and the Solvay estate, a real jewel with its park, its castle and the creations of the artist Folon. You will head south via the Aywiers Abbey and the Château de Bousval vineyards to reach Villers-la-Ville via Lasne and Genappe. Leaving this Abbey, founded in the 12th century, you will go back up to the lake of Genval through the centre of Walloon Brabant. A day under the sign of heritage and wine.

START: a loop that starts from your hotel in Waterloo and goes to your hotel in Genval. Follow the GPX track using your app.



TO BE DISCOVERED

1 Folon Foundation

Located a few minutes from Brussels, the Folon Foundation, created and designed by the Belgian artist Jean-Michel Folon himself, presents more than 40 years of creation. The museum, located in the wonderful Domaine régional Solvay, houses more than 500 of his works. Discover the multiple facets of this artist and his universe: watercolours, serigraphs, engravings, posters, diverted objects, stained glass windows,



sculptures, etc. The highly original scenography takes us on an amazing journey. Films, sound and visual effects enliven this interactive journey. To complete the discovery of the museum, the Folon Foundation offers a wide range of educational activities.

After your visit, take advantage of the 227 hectares of the Domaine régional Solvay to stroll through its varied landscapes bordered by ponds and inhabited by remarkable flora and fauna.

2 Domaine régional Solvay Château de la Hulpe

A real jewel in the crown of Walloon Brabant, the Domaine régional Solvay in La Hulpe is full of charm. No matter where you go, you will be captivated by the green and enchanting landscape that surrounds you. The Château de La Hulpe sits atop the hill and shows off its best features. Its French garden is a great place for souvenir photos and the view is like a postcard... The castle cannot be visited. Not far from there, discreet but present, Folon reigns through the poetry of his art. As if in an open book, the Folon Foundation will reveal the multiple facets of this Belgian artist. Hidden in the four corners of the park, you will see some of his sculptures, guardians of the park. As you can see, whether you are looking for a moment of relaxation or escape, the Domaine régional Solvay will take you on a timeless journey.

3 Aywiers Abbey

The Aywiers Abbey was founded in 1215 by Cistercian nuns from Liège (the Awirs). Thanks to donations from the lords of Brussels, it grew to 2000 hectares. Numerous farms, barns, mills and collieries were part of its heritage. Saint Lutgarde lived for 40 years in Aywiers Abbey. As the patron saint of Flanders, she is said to have performed many miracles. During the French Revolution, the Abbey was sold and its new owner destroyed part of it to sell the materials. This did not detract from the mysterious charm of the place.

Today, the garden surrounded by its old walls is located in the centre of the Old Abbey. The English-style park, planted in the last century, contains superb century-old trees: a sumptuous Rosacea oak, beautiful lime trees, beeches, field maples, etc.

For more than 25 years, the organisation of the Jardins d'Aywiers has been restoring the garden. The Abbey's aromatic and medicinal plant garden has been recreated and hundreds of trees, shrubs and rare plants have been planted to restore the garden to its former glory.

4 Microbrewery of the Hostieux  

Moines of the Abbey of Villers – Brabant

The large vats house the three beers of the Hostieux Moines, namely the Lumineuse, the Ténébreuse and the Christmas beer, the Dom Placide. Activities and visits are planned throughout the year.



5 Abbey of Villers-la-Ville  

The Abbey of Villers, founded in 1146, is one of the most prestigious testimonies of the life of the monks of the Cistercian Order.

Its ruins reflect several architectural styles. The abbey is considered one of the most beautiful architectural sites in Europe.

6 Villers-la-Vigne 

Villers-la-Vigne is the vineyard of the Abbey of Villers-la-Ville. Rehabilitated in the 1990s, it consists of a plain and four south-facing terraces, nestled in the middle of a walled area surrounded by stone walls several hundred years old. The vineyard comprises 15 ares planted. With more than 200 members, the Brotherhood of the Villers Abbey Vineyard maintains the vineyard as a team and thus revives the old Abbey vineyard.

7 Château de Bousval vineyard 

Discover the beautiful history of the Château de Bousval vineyard. A local producer who offers you a wide variety of products.

The story is that of a nature lover who owned abandoned land where he decided to establish a vineyard in order to revive it. Three grape varieties share these hilly lands: Pinot Noir, Pinot Gris and Chardonnay. Here, no inherited wine, but a wine in the making, the result of the meeting of the young vine with the Belgian sun, the fauna, the varied flora and the micro-organisms of the Bousval soil.

8 The castle of the princes of Merode 

Heir to a 13th century fortress, the castle of Rixensart has preserved its layout in

The building is a quadrilateral structure with a castral chapel, which is now a parish church. Built between 1631 and 1662, the four wings of the quadrilateral are punctuated by octagonal turrets and a tower-porch. But the most remarkable feature is certainly the colonnaded gallery, which is made up of lowered arcades

set on Tuscan columns in white stone. Owned by the de Mérode family since 1715, and listed by the Walloon Heritage Institute, the castle benefited in 2010 from subsidised roof repairs. Listed monument (15-05-1964) Exceptional heritage of Wallonia. **Warning: not open to the public!**

You will again travel through Walloon Brabant in the direction of Ottignies and Court St-Etienne. You will then reach the town of Walhain, known as the geographical centre of Belgium and for its feudal castle. You will then go up to the student city of Louvain-la-Neuve via country roads. Belgium's youngest city (built in the 1970s) is known for its special atmosphere, urban architecture and the importance given to greenery. Louvain-la-Neuve is a pedestrianised and dynamic city.

START: a loop that starts from your hotel in Genvai to your hotel in Louvain-la-Neuve. Follow the GPX track using your app.



TO BE DISCOVERED

1 Microbrewery Tête Chargée in Limelette

The Tête Chargée microbrewery is located in Limelette and offers top-fermented pure malt beers from organic farming.

The production complies with the Belgian Beer of Wallonia Charter: brewing and bottling by the craftsman, a regional and Belgian identity.

2 The strange spinning stone at Court Saint-Etienne

In Court-Saint-Etienne, you will observe a very strange flat stone weighing about 4 tons located at the foot of a sunken path. Strange legends have been attributed to it, the most common of which tells us that every evening, when midnight strikes in the church of Court, the stone makes a half-turn on itself.

3 Marette Farm

First mentioned at the end of the 16th century, it is particularly well known for having been the scene of an episode on the day of the Battle of Waterloo. It was on this farm, which takes its name from its last owner under the Ancien Régime, that Marshal Grouchy, having received a mission from the Emperor Napoleon to pursue the retreating Prussian army, set up his headquarters on the morning of 18 June 1815.

The marshal convenes his staff there and takes stock with Generals Gérard and Vandamme. It was now 11.30 am when the first cannon shots were heard in the distance; the Battle of Waterloo was beginning. It is then that General Gérard proposes to stop pursuing the Prussians and to «march with cannon». To which Grouchy replied: «My duty is to carry out the Emperor's orders». The discussion is closed.

Legend has it that Grouchy was late arriving on the plain of Waterloo because he had stopped for too long to eat strawberries from the farm's vegetable garden.

It is a square-shaped farmhouse with a two-storey main building built on a high base, dating from the mid-18th century and featuring a hip roof. The 17th century porch is the oldest part of the present building. This porch has a superb frame in blue stone with bushhammering. **Warning: private property - not open to the public.**

4 The feudal castle of Walhain  

At the confluence of the Hain and the ri des Radas, in a relatively well-preserved topographical setting, nestle the ruins of the feudal castle. This was the centre of a lordship that developed in the second half of the 12th century with the Walhain family. After passing through various hands, the lordship fell into the hands of the powerful «de Glimes» and «de Bergues» families from 1430 to 1567. This was its hour of glory because, in 1532, Charles-Quint established the land of Walhain as the capital of a county that included many surrounding villages as well as the town of Wavre. It was at this time that the castle was converted into a pleasure castle. The feudal castle has been classified as a Historic Monument since 1955 and as a Site since 1980. The site is accessible on request at the Walhain Tourist Office.

5 Moulin du Tiège 

Its toponym comes from the Walloon word «Tidje» which means a ridge line between two valleys. In our commune, while water mills already appeared in the Middle Ages, it was not until 1615 that the first windmill appeared in the landscape. Most of them were built in the course of the 19e century. The Tiège mill was built in 1834 by the Thienpont family, then owners of the Matourée farm. It was the subject of a conflict between parishes and witnessed two fatal accidents. Its history came to an end in 1946 when its wings stopped turning after 112 years of activity. A jewel in the crown of Brabant's industrial heritage, the Tiège mill remains one of the rare well-preserved examples in our region, especially since it still has most of its internal mechanics. The mill is a truncated cone-shaped rotating brick cap mill with a roof reminiscent of a buckwheat helmet. The mill of Tiège was classified as a Historic Monument in 1946. **Attention: private property - not open to the public**

6 Musée L 

It is the first large-scale university museum in Belgium! During your visit, turn into Indiana Jones and discover more than 1500 works of art from all kinds of civilizations. A mishmash that will not leave you indifferent... Invent. Dialogue. A whole art. This is the «motto» of the L Museum. Take the time to admire this emblematic building of modern Belgian architecture: it is a sublime work of art in itself!

7 Hergé Museum 

By visiting the Hergé Museum in Louvain-la-Neuve, you will learn more about the life and work of Hergé, the father of Tintin and Snowy. More than 80 original drawings, 800 photos, documents and various objects have been brought together in this magical, bright and daring place. Its architect, Christian de Portzamparc, a poet of volume and space, has dreamed up and designed an unusual building for a heritage that is just as unusual. Surprise guaranteed with the multi-talented designer! A graphic artist, publicist, caricaturist, scriptwriter and painter in his spare time, Hergé was all of these things and much more. Discover the fabulous career of one of the greatest artists of the twentieth century.

Linking Leuven to Louvain-la-Neuve cannot be done without a little bit of history between its major Belgian university cities. The University of Leuven was founded in 1425 in Flemish Brabant. It is one of the oldest universities in the world. During the 20th century, the Catholic University of Leuven saw its student population gradually split between Flemish and French speakers. At the end of the 1960s, the presence of French-speaking students and professors was increasingly contested by their Dutch-speaking compatriots. In 1968, paving stones were thrown and demonstrations were held with cries of «Walen Buiten» («The Walloons out»). The situation was such that the government of the day fell. This community quarrel, combined with the sharp increase in the student population, forced all the French-speaking faculties of the UCL to move to Wallonia. The municipality of Ottignies hosted the project on the Lauzelle plateau. The first stone of the new town was laid on 2 February 1971. You will leave Louvain-la-Neuve in Walloon Brabant to reach Wavre and its Adventure Park. You will then travel through Flemish Brabant to discover its architectural gems. You will arrive in the historic city of Leuven via the Heverlee woods and the magnificent Parc Abbey!



During this stage you will mainly drive along the Dyle. In the land of the Dyle, the brewers even had a canal dug to transport the barrels of beer from Leuven to other cities. But where does the Dyle come from? The Dyle has its source in Houtain-le-val in Walloon Brabant. It flows through the municipalities of Court-Saint-Étienne, Ottignies-Louvain-la-Neuve and Wavre. In Flemish Brabant, the Dyle becomes the Dijle and flows through Rhode-Sainte-Agathe, Sint-Joris-Weert, Korbeek-Dijle and Heverlee before reaching Leuven. In Leuven the Dyle also passes through the large beguinage. It will then continue its journey as far as Mechelen, before forming the Rupel by mixing its waters with the Nèthe. A day where you can taste beer, walk through provincial parks and visit a zoo. On arrival in Mechelen, you will pass Kazern Dossin for an important memorial before reaching the hotel, famous for being housed in a former church.

1 The Little Beguinage

The first mention of the Little Beguinage dates back to 1272. The district consisted of a street and two dead-end alleys where the women who served in the nearby St. Gertrude's Abbey lived. In 2000, the Little Beguinage was extensively restored and sold to private individuals. All that remains of the beguinage are about thirty houses in traditional Flemish style.

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TO BE DISCOVERED

1 Bois de la Cambre

The Bois de la Cambre is located at the end of Avenue Louise. This English-style park with its forest-like layout owes its name to the nearby Abbaye de la Cambre. It is a unique jewel of Brussels' heritage, which has nothing to envy to the emblematic «Central Park» in New York. People come here all year round to walk, jog, cycle and rollerblade. At weekends, several roads are closed to cars to make room for alternative mobility. The Bois de la Cambre is an offshoot of the Forêt de Soignes. It covers an area of 123 hectares. In 2004, the wood was declared a special conservation area by Natura 2000. More than 80 trees are listed in the inventory of remarkable trees in the Brussels-Capital Region. In addition, the Bois de la Cambre is



home to 16 species of bats. From time to time, roe deer come out of the Forêt de Soignes to roam the area.



2 Forêt de Soignes

Although it has had a particularly rich history, due to demographic changes and land use, its original relief has been remarkably preserved. Thus, under the dark canopy of this cathedral beech forest, the area where reindeer and mammoths once walked is exceptionally present.

Numerous paths and theme trails lead you through the entire estate. Children can have a great time in the animal park, the playgrounds or the mini cars.

And let's not forget the arboretum of deciduous and coniferous trees, which unveils a carpet of daffodils, azaleas and hyacinths in spring. The oriental-inspired rock garden with more than 1200 plant species offers an unparalleled palette of colours.

5 Oud Beersel

The Oud Beersel Brewery, founded in 1882, is one of the last authentic lambic breweries in Belgium. It is known for its artisanal lambic brewed according to old traditional methods.

The lambic matures for up to three years in wooden barrels, after which it is cut up and processed into Vieille Gueuze. By fermenting sweet-tasting cherries in the lambic and after a second fermentation in the bottle, the Vieille Kriek is created. This unique brewing process



with spontaneous fermentation is possible in Belgium, namely in the regions of Pajottenland, the Senne Valley and Brussels, due to the presence of specific microflora.

6 Brasserie Trois Fontaines 

The Trois Fontaines Brewery, called Brouwerij Drie Fonteynen in Dutch, is a brewery located in Beersel in the province of Flemish Brabant in Belgium. It mainly produces lambic beers, typical of the Senne valley. In 1883, an inn was built by Jacobus Vanderlinden as an annex to a gueuzerie in Beersel. At that time, the village had about ten of them. The name of the three porcelain beer pumps that served lambic, faro and kriek. The company was later taken over by Jacobus Vanderlinden's son, Jan-Baptist Vanderlinden, known as Tisjke Potter. When he became mayor of Beersel in 1953, he decided to sell the pub. Author: Wikipedia

7 Beersel Castle 

Beersel Castle, surrounded by a moat, is one of the last well-preserved examples of medieval military architecture in our country. It was built around 1420 as an outpost for the defence of Brussels. The castle's fortifications are classic: a deep moat, a drawbridge, crenellated ramparts and loopholes. The castle appears in the Bob and Bobette album 'The Treasure of Beersel'.

8 Boon Brewery 

The beginnings of what is now the Boon Brewery date back to 1680. The brewery was named after its new owner each time and in 1977 René De Vits sold it to Frank Boon as a gueuzerie.

The brewery is one of the few to use the 'cloudy wort' method, the oldest traditional brewing method for lambic. Boon Brewery supplies lambic to pubs and produces a classic Oude Geuze and Oude Kriek, as well as a strong-tasting Boon Kriek.
